This project uniquely utilizes multi-lingual audio technology to serve thousands of community members relying on forests and land for livelihoods and food security across rural Liberia, mainly low-literate women and youth, whom have historically been denied access to land and other resources. Rural communities, especially women and youth, need clear and current information on their legal land rights, which have changed considerably since 2018.

The idea of using talking books for land rights is ingenious: people (i.e. those who can't read) are educated about their rights. The 3 dollar books create a foundation so all liberians can protect their land claims and advocate for their rights."

The innovation is a solar powered cold storage preservation technology that extends shelf life of perishable crops from 5 days to 21 days while maintaining texture, flavor, and nutrients. This solution is solving the problem of postharvest losses. According to the UN Food and Agriculture Organization, 30-50 percent of food produced. is lost before it reaches the market which affects food security and contributes to carbon emissions. Our innovation is helping farmers rise out of poverty and become financially stable, providing green jobs for young people, promote food security and reduce environmental footprints from food waste.

Jury Statement





"Happiness Safeguarding Stations" program has been cooperating with the four major convenience stores. It offers meals and address hunger in high risk households to students and children under 18-year-olds, capped at NT\$80 per meal. The program doesn't need students and children to be verified that as long as they give the basic information, they can receive free meals, their details are forwarded to the Service Centre for High Risk Families. The Centre follows up within 24 hours, through school counsellors or social workers, and additional assistance is provided if needed.

A simple, human-centered solution that can be easily implemented in different countries with convenience stores as part of their culture.
